1.0 CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chair Daniel at 6:00 P.M. A quorum was present.

1.1 PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Members and guests joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.

1.2 INTRODUCTIONS

Members and guests introduced themselves.

2.0 ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AGENDA

To allow sufficient time for the panel discussion, regular reports and commissions business was suspended except for the swearing in of new commissioners.

3.0 CORRESPONDENCE

There were no correspondences.

#### 4.0 APPROVE MINUTES OF THE SEPTEMBER 10, 2014 MEETING

It was moved by Commissioner Baker and seconded by Commissioner Yates to approve the minutes as written. The motion carried.

#### 5.0 COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS/PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no commissioner announcements or public comments.

#### 6.0 SWEARING IN OF NEW COMMISSIONERS

Janae Teal and Meredith Williams were sworn in as new commissioners by Judge Wilson. Members and guest joined in welcoming them both aboard. The total commissioner count now stands at nine active commissioners and one more who intends to remain on the commission after returning from his leave of absence in September, 2015.

#### 7.0 PANELDISCUSSION

The remainder of the meeting consisted of a panel discussion with the heads of various agencies with an interest in juvenile justice and delinquency prevention issues. Judge Wilson, Bill Damiano from Probation, incoming District Attorney Maggie Flemming, and Eureka Police Chief Andy Mills spoke. Some of the issues discussed included the implementation of evidence-based practices, budgetary issues, the on-going struggle with the handling of juvenile competency cases, and the possibility of creating a juvenile diversion program in eureka similar to Arcata's. Judge Wilson strongly suggested that the commission make a point of reporting periodically to the Board of Supervisors, perhaps semi-annually. An extensive discussion period followed the panel presentation. A "debriefing" will take place among commissioners during the November JJDPC meeting.

#### 8.0 ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 P.M.
